



- ELLIS FIBER GREASE LOCK FILTER SYSTEM
 - Reduces airborne grease
 - Reduced water usage1.1 mm gal.
- 150k gal. Grease collected annually
 - On-campus = triple bottom line

Green Infrastructure

- Identified the best opportunities for installing green infrastructure based upon soil, topography, hydrology, FAA regulations, visibility and other criteria.
- EPA 319 Clean Water Act grant to help in the early implementation of the identified green infrastructure projects.
- Biofiltration, developing infiltration in a downstream detention pond, and filter planter boxes to treat roof runoff near the terminals.
