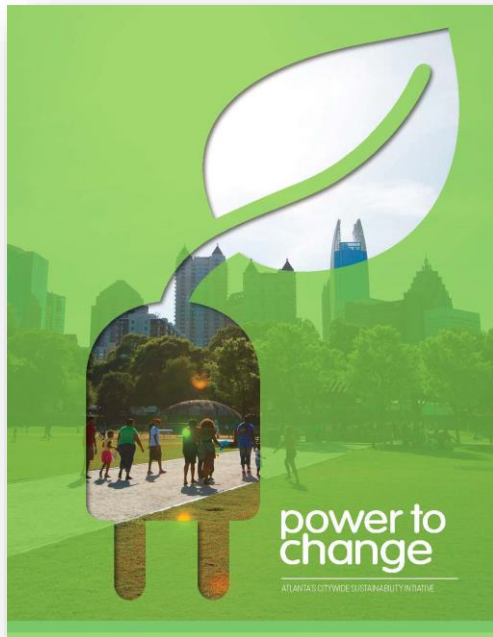

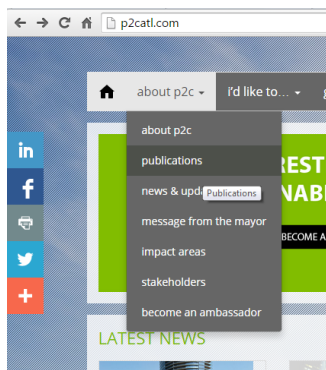

Why should Atlanta adopt a CAP?

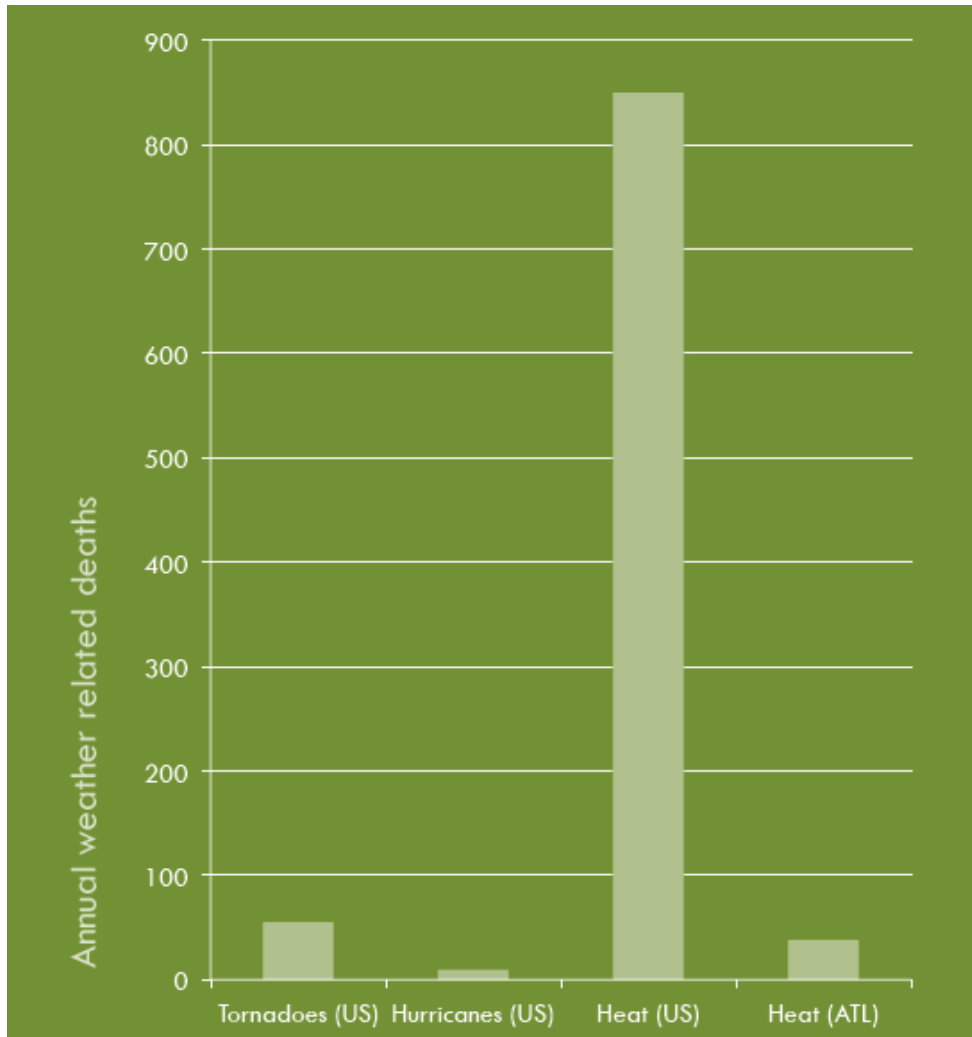
- Recognize the risk that climate change poses to its citizens and economy

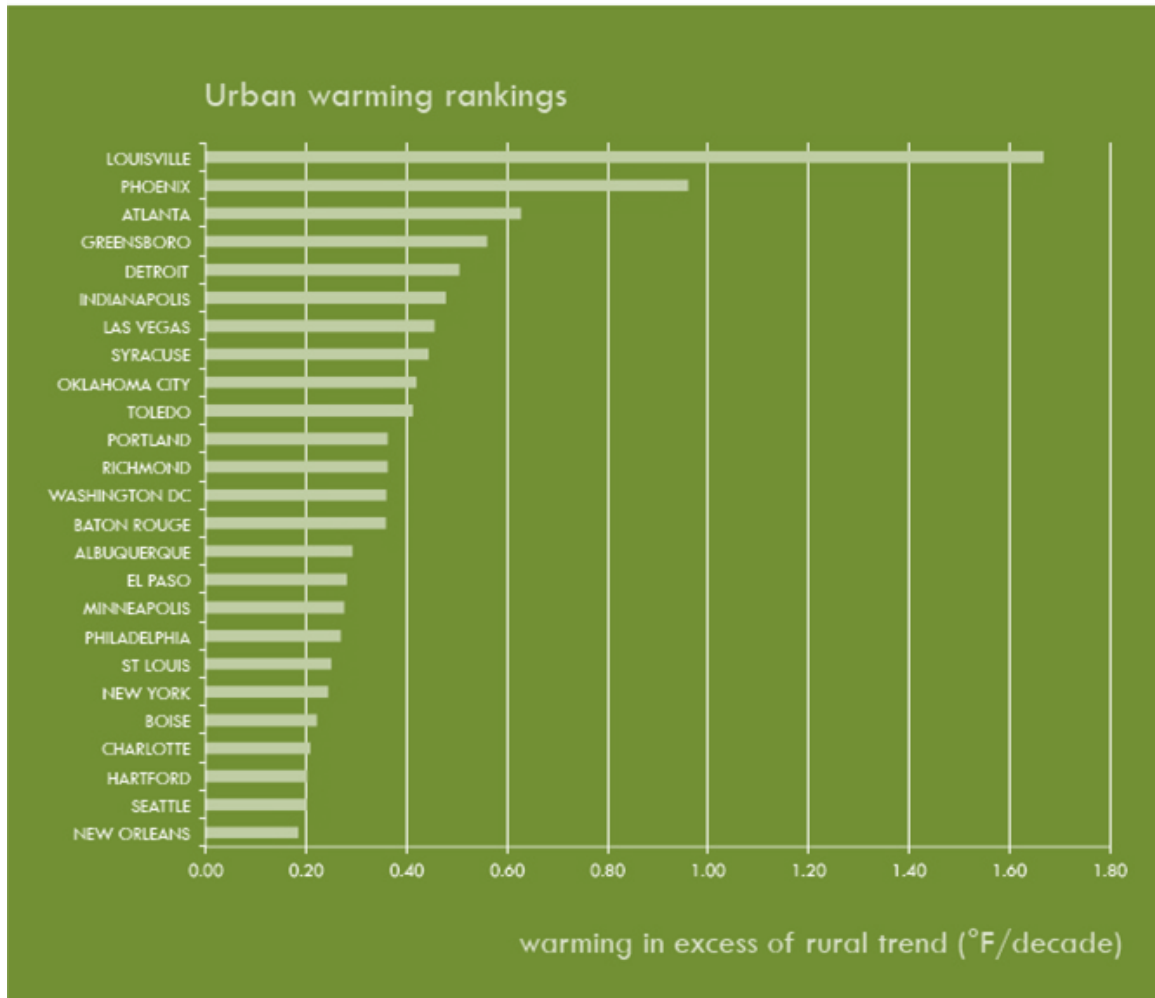

Urban warming rankings (2010)

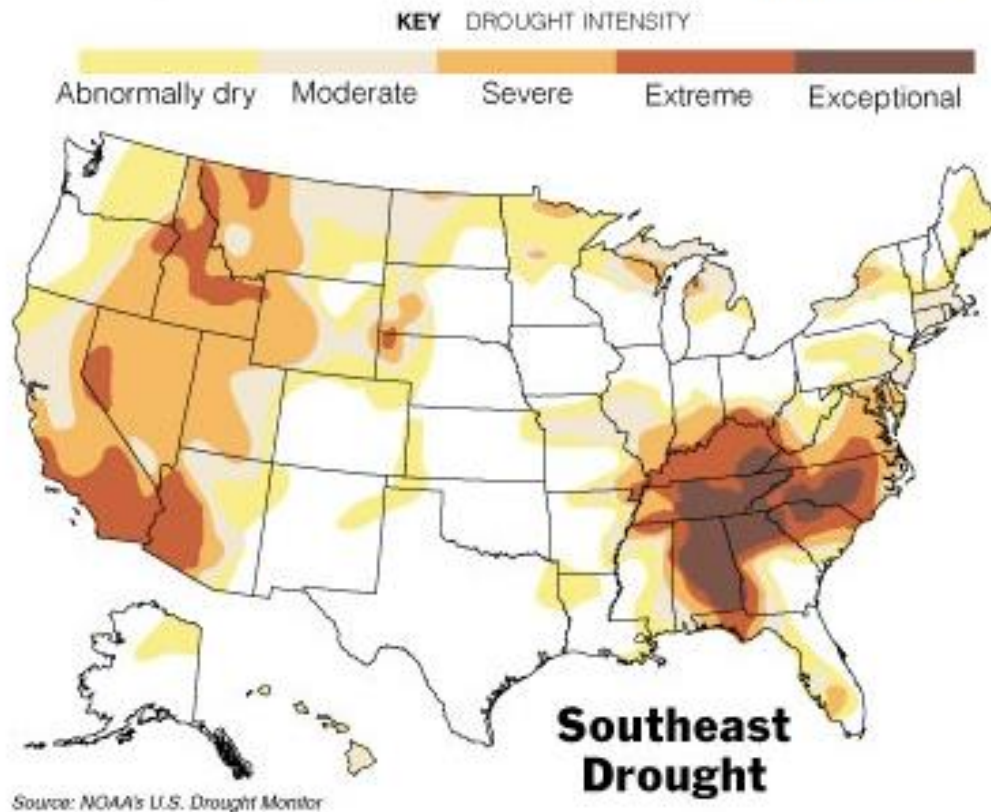

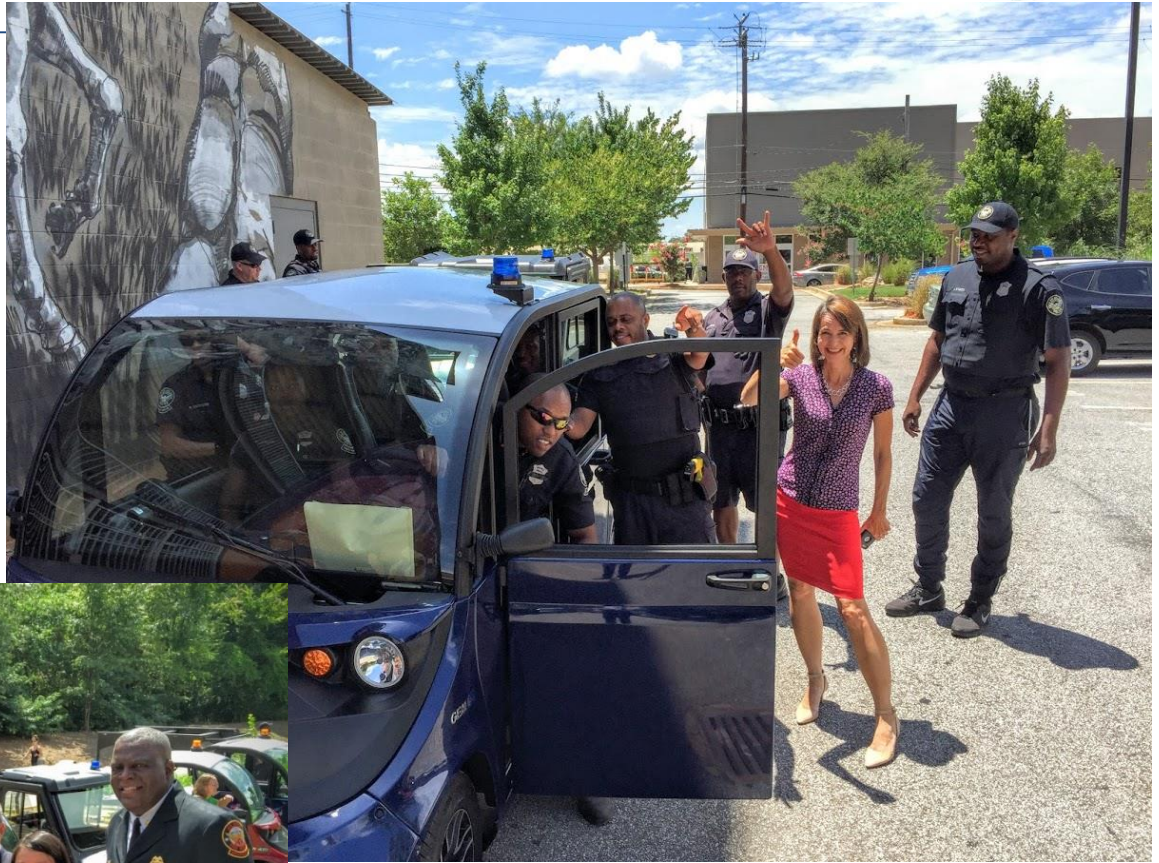
