Protecting Annapolis is expensive. Resilience is not just about engineering—it's about securing the funds to make it happen.




### **Planning with Creativity**

An existing City asset, the downtown municipal Hillman Garage, was used as a "downpayment" on resiliency work at City Dock. Renovation and operations over 30 work helped fund a \$24M concession fund, plus annual operations income.





## Keeping the Water Out (For Now)

Short-term: Pumps, Backflow Preventers, and Barriers






We've installed sump pumps and backflow preventers to keep water out of storm drains and found an innovative Dutch "barrier" solution. These are stopgap measures, not permanent solutions.
